

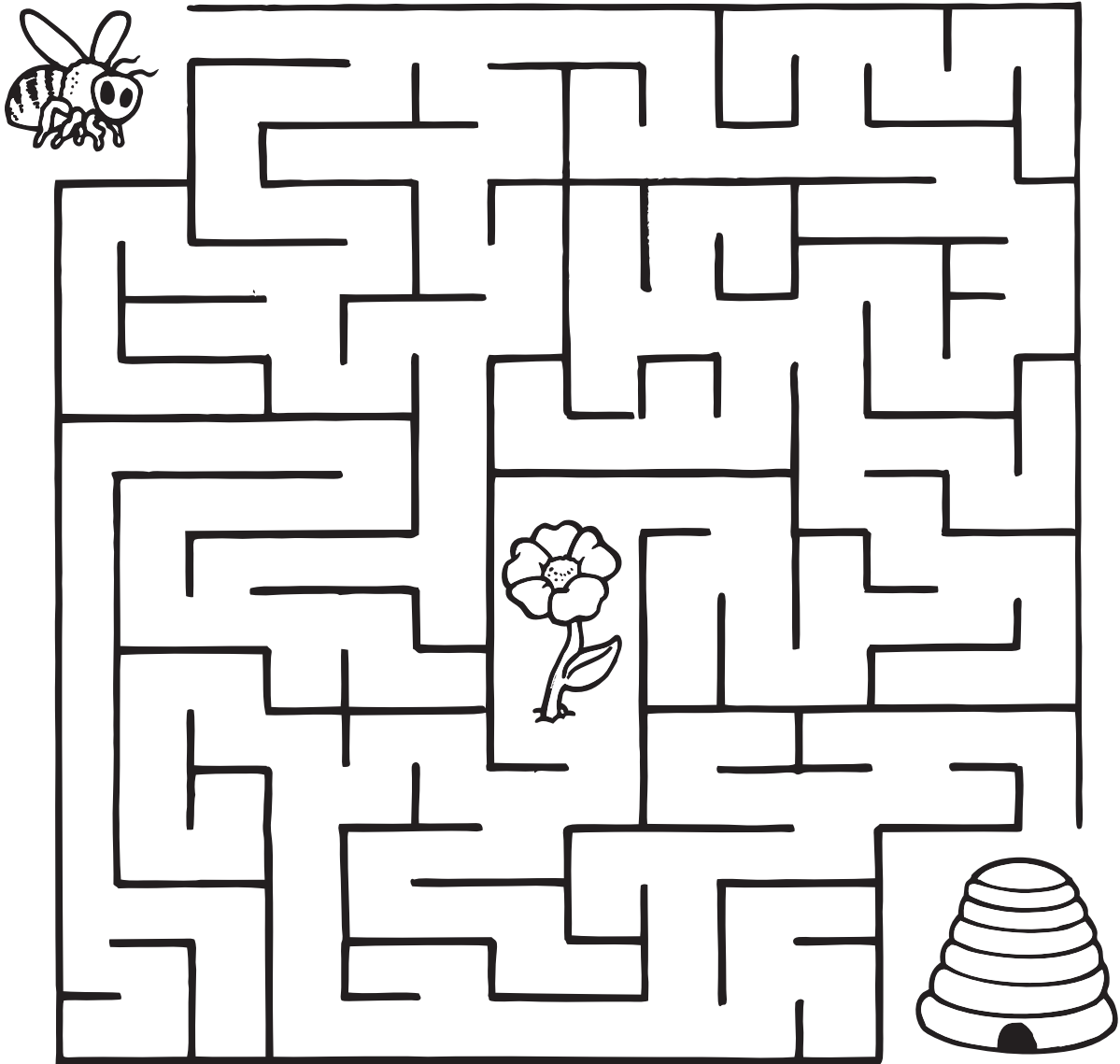

Have you ever wondered how bees make honey? It takes a lot of work!

First, a bee visits a flower. The bee collects nectar from the flower. Nectar is like a mix of sugar and water. The bee takes that nectar and flies it back to the beehive. Other bees at the hive help take the nectar and store it in the hive. The bees help keep the nectar warm. They also beat their wings to move air across the nectar. This helps turn it into honey.

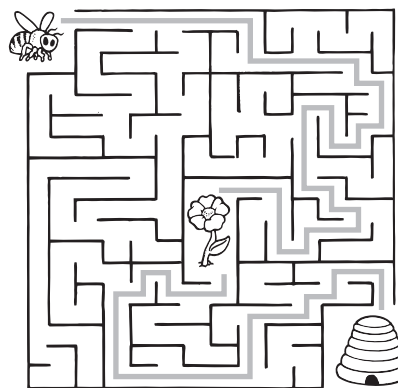
