Thesaurus Power Worksheet

A thesaurus is a reference book that contains lists of synonyms and antonyms.

road (n): an open way for people or vehicles upon which to travel. *This <u>road leads straight into downtown.</u>*

SYNONYMS:

alley: a narrow road behind or between buildings. This back door leads to a dark alley.

boulevard: a wide, main road, often lined with trees or separated with a grassy median strip. *The boulevard is decorated for the Fourth of July parade.*

highway: a main road between cities. *Take this <u>highway five miles south, and you will end up in Charleston.*</u>

street: a local road in a village or town, usually lined with sidewalks and houses. *Police headquarters is on the same street as the fire station.*

trail: a narrow dirt or gravel trail through woods or unsettled regions. *Pioneer families took this trail west to the prairie lands.*

turnpike: a public highway in which a toll is paid by travelers. *The next exit off the turnpike is twenty-four miles away.*

ANTONYMS: blockade, cul-de-sac, dead end, detour.
