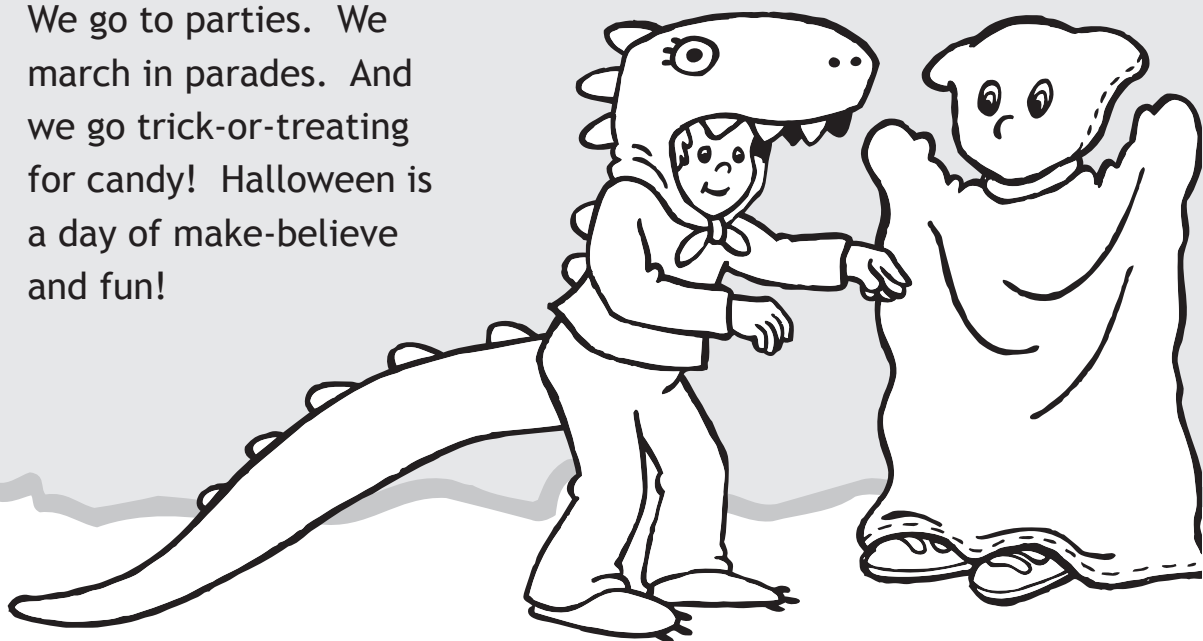


Halloween

Halloween for Dogs

Directions: Read the story. Then complete the activity.

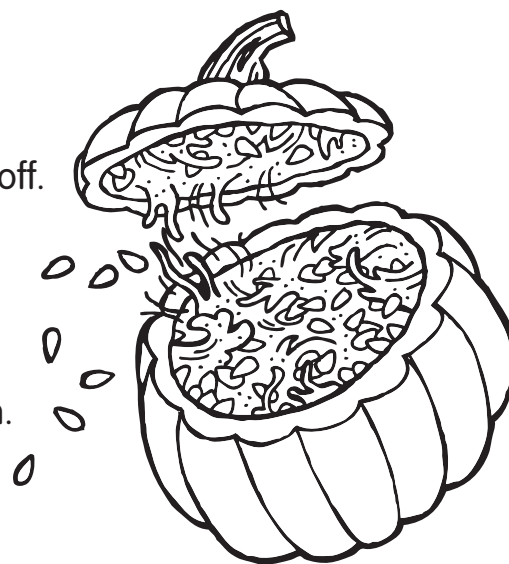
How to Roast Pumpkin Seeds

Directions: Read the passage. Then answer the questions.

In the fall, you will see lots of pumpkins. Pumpkins are a fruit. They are big and round. They are orange. They have brown stems that stick out of the tops. They are heavy.

Inside of each pumpkin, there are seeds. They are good to eat. They make a great snack. But you can't eat them right out of the pumpkin. You have to roast them first. Here's how:

- ① Scoop the seeds out of the pumpkin.
- ② Put the seeds in a strainer and rinse.
- ③ Pat the seeds with a paper towel to dry them off.
- ④ Put the seeds on a large baking sheet.
- ⑤ Drizzle olive oil onto the seeds and stir.
- ⑥ Sprinkle the seeds with salt.
- ⑦ With adult help, put the seeds in a 350°F oven.
- ⑧ Roast the seeds for 15 minutes.
- ⑨ Let the seeds cool off for 5 minutes.
- ⑩ Eat!
