- 11. Student sketches should show two trees. The tree on the left should be labeled *coniferous*. It should grow upward, have needles instead of leaves, and be triangular in shape. The tree on the right should be labeled *deciduous*. It should grow outward and have leaves (or it could be bare, as if the leaves have fallen off).
- 12. The narrator is most likely between the ages of 13 and 17. We know from Source 3 that he has 28 permanent teeth. We know from Source 4 that a child loses his/her primary teeth by age 13 but doesn't grow the final four permanent teeth until around age 17 at the earliest.
- 13. Two other terms for "baby teeth" are "primary teeth" and "deciduous teeth." The term "primary teeth" is explicitly given in Sources 3 and 4. The term "deciduous teeth" can be inferred. We know from Source 1 that humans have "deciduous teeth" (teeth that fall out as the human develops). This process is dramatized in Source 3, where the narrator refers to a "long word" for the sister's baby teeth. From the clues given, we can infer that this long word is *deciduous*.
